OVERVIEW OF THE LESSON

2. In the exploration, you will create group posters that define the following words: realistic, artistic, social, investigative, enterprising, and conventional, using words, pictures, and symbols.
3. You will compare your understanding of the topics as you have defined in your research and identify where you see yourself in each interest. While you connect Interests (RIASEC) categories, you will rank the categories by how important they are to you.
